BIG "GOOD" WORDS OF THE BIBLE

THERE ARE MANY WORDS IN THE BIBLE THAT OFTEN WE USE INTERCHANGEABLY WITHOUT REALIZING IT. HOWEVER, THIS CAN LEAD US TO LOSE THE GREAT AND RICH TAPESTRY OF GOD'S MESSAGE OF SALVATION TO US. WE MUST REMEMBER THAT THE WORDS THAT ARE USED ARE NOT USED RANDOMLY OR HAPHAZARDLY, BUT TO CONVEY A VERY SPECIAL MESSAGE ABOUT A CERTAIN ASPECT OF GOD'S GRACIOUS GOODNESS TO US. THIS IS NOT ONLY OF EXCEEDING COMFORT TO US, BUT AS WE PREACH THE GOSPEL, IT MAKES US MUCH BETTER PREPARE TO SHARE A MORE SPECIFIC MESSAGE OF SALVATION TO COMFORT THE HEART.

Grace

For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast. **Ephesians 2:8-9**

Grace is arguably the most important and most used word in the Scripture regarding our salvation. But, what is meant by grace or "charis" (in the original Greek) and "Chesed" (in the original Hebrew)? The idea is simply this: "that which delights". Therefore "to be gracious" is "to show one's delight." The simplest picture of that is the picture of gift-giving. I delight in my children, therefore, I show my delight by giving gifts to them, both daily gifts (food, clothing, house, home, etc.) but also special gifts (Birthday, Christmas, etc.)

But, the major difference between grace, as we show it to others and as it is shown by God, is in the idea of merit. For instance, there must be something in the object of our grace that causes us to be gracious. For instance, when I ask my daughter why I love her, she will say, "Because I am good, because I am nice, because I picked up my room." Notice how the cause of grace and delight is in them, and because of that, I show them my delight.

But, what this passage from Ephesians shows us is that "grace," in the case of God, is not motivated by anything, is us. This passage rules out once and for all the idea that God loves us for any reason in us. God's grace is undeserved. But it is even more than that. God's delight is the opposite of what we deserve. All that we deserve is wrath and punishment because of our disobedience and unbelief. But, God instead shows love, mercy, kindness and peace.

You see, the grace of God originates in God's own heart. The greatest characteristic of God is that he is his own cause for saving us. This is played out in our salvation. Every part of our salvation originates and is carried out by God himself, apart from any of our works, as Paul makes clear in this passage. Even the act of accepting God's grace (believing in Christ Jesus for salvation), is a gift of God, given to us through the preaching of the Gospel and the work of the Holy Spirit.

Now, what is unique comfort that this word "grace" gives to a Christian? It is the eternal reminder that salvation and our certainty of salvation, do not come from looking in our heart, or looking at the works of our hands. Our certainty of salvation comes from looking out and up at the blessed cross of Calvary and the words, "It is finished." God from beginning to end delights in us, and he has revealed this love to us in Christ alone through in his Word. Grace is a reminder to always turn to the Word of God, to the cross of Calvary, to the waters of baptism, and not to our own heart to see, "I have been saved. I am a child of God." In the words of the great hymn,

By grace I'm saved, grace free and boundless;
My soul, believe and doubt it not.
Why stagger at this word of promise?
Hath Scripture ever falsehood taught?
Nay; then this word must true remain;
By grace thou, too, shalt heav'n obtain.
(TLH 373:1)

A student from Zion has received a \$1,000 Zion Trust Fund Scholarship to attend Martin Luther College (MLC).

MLC has a Congregational Partner Grant that could turn the scholarship into \$3,200, if our congregation could raise \$600 more dollars for the student. And, WE DID IT!

Through a couple of generous donors, our goal was met. The Zion Trust Fund grant of \$1,000, plus our congregation's additional \$600 will be matched.

The congregations' \$1,600 will be used for the first semester, and the MLC grant will be applied to the second semester.

going to the Mankato Children's Museum, while the 3rd and 4th graders went to Minneopa State Park. The 3rd and 4th Graders helped plant trees at the cemetery in Gibbon. The whole school participated in a Pod Day, which was a school track day. The 7th and 8th graders taught different track events. The 5th and 6th graders were group leaders who brought the K-4 graders to the designated track events. Likewise, the entire school attended Fort Day at Fort Ridgely where much fun was had by all. The older site's end of the year trip included visiting Canterbury Downs -Stable tour, Mill City Museum, the Guthrie Theater, and the Three Rivers Outdoor Education School, where they did archery, geocaching and sackline.

Our students performed very well at the Redwood track meet (May 2) and the Sleepy Eye track meet (May 9). They brought home 62 ribbons from Redwood and 67 from Sleepy Eye. That is about double what we earned last year.

In the Kindergarten room, they had seven caterpillars go into their chrysalis, and we are waiting to see how many butterflies would fly off. Mrs. Doehling also visited and taught the students about flowers, and let each student take one flower and one pumpkin home.

The children also thoroughly enjoyed the NWEA. What is the NWEA you ask? Well, the children get to prove their knowledge in this standardized test by Northwest Evaluation Association. Let me tell you this is one of the most anticipated weeks during the whole school year. On a serious note, Mr. Seehafer said, "Students showed good growth from last fall."

On Wednesday, May 21, we were blessed to have 12 students graduate from PLS. Seven of the students have been together since Kindergarten, with five joining us along the way. We ask God to guide them with wisdom, patience, and courage as they face new challenges and opportunities. Surround them with Your love and fill their hearts with peace and confidence. May they shine brightly as they continue on their journey. Amen.

Building on the Rock Plea

Dear Friends of Minnesota Valley Lutheran High School:

We have received such blessings through our new classrooms, the Activities Commons, the Storm Fieldhouse, and the newly renovated Fine Arts Center. Because of your incredible generosity, our students now thrive in spaces that inspire learning, creativity, and excellence.

Thanks to the new Fine Arts Center, our students could rehearse and produce "Newsies" in a first-rate space. Thanks to the Activities Commons and Storm Fieldhouse, our athletes can hold practices for multiple sports at the same time. Thanks to the new classrooms, we have facilities suited for Project Lead the Way and more. Thank you for being a part of something truly special!

When we began this project, we were blessed to receive a loan from the WELS Church Extension Fund (CEF). The current interest rate of 4.32% is fixed until June 30, 2028. The time has come for us to start making monthly mortgage payments. The more that we can pay upfront before the monthly payments start, the better our situation will be.

To help make this a reality, any <u>new</u> gifts we receive between now and <u>June 10</u> will be applied as a special payment to the BOTR loan. This will reduce the size of future loan payments, and will also reduce the total amount of interest we will pay over the life of the loan. For every \$100,000 we raise, we will save \$6,800 annually in cash payments.

God's Treasures Updates

Director's Report - May 8, 2025

The month of April included two Easter evangelism opportuneities for our God's Treasures families. Our annual Ever Easter event was held at Zion on the Saturday prior to Palm Sunday, and our preschoolers sang at the opening of worship the last Sunday in April. Their songs included *In Christ Alone* and the *Doxology* with a recitation of John 3:16. The majority of the students and their families were present to join us in worship.

The Commission on Lutheran Schools in conjunction with WELS Lutheran Schools visited God's Treasures on April 30 as well as other early childhood ministries (ECM) and Lutheran Elementary Schools in southern Minnesota. The Minnesota District was their focus this spring, so it came at a good time for us to develop stronger partnerships with the resources that WELS offers. Professor Jen Mehlberg from MLC and LaShawn Smith, Director of Jesus Loves Me Learning Center in Mankato and Minnesota District ECM Coordinator received an opportunity to tour our facility and talk with teachers and staff. The goals of the visit were:

- Build positive relationships with teachers and leaders of our schools.
- Grow in our understanding of the unique characteristics of our schools.
- Grow in our understanding of the opportunities and challenges of our schools.
- Identify and understand the critical issues with which our schools are working.
- Use knowledge gained to guide CLS priorities and plans.

On Friday, May 2 six preschoolers attended "Goldilocks" at the MLC Children's Theater. The students rode to MLC on the bus with Prairie Lutheran School and had a picnic lunch in the park. For some of the students, this was their first experience riding on school bus.

Work continues on staffing heading into the summer months and as Taylor Natalie nears the end of her one-year call. We are looking forward to having Charlotte Hoffmann and Emma Niebuhr provide us with some much-needed help, beginning in June. An Assignment Committee request and call packet has been submitted to our District President for a PreK 3 teacher. We will find out as late as Call Day on May 17 if a graduate is assigned to us. While we wait, please pray that we are able to staff our center with qualified teachers regardless of the outcome on Call Day.

Pioneers summer camps are coming up fast too! Here is the info we have:

June 19 - Backyard and Beyond, Pioneers Day Camp. 9:45 am to 2:30 pm, St. Peter Lutheran Church, 427 W Mulberry St., St. Peter, MN, for girls & boys entering Kindergarten through 3rd Grade. The cost for the playground fencing SW corner; gutters on SE corner roof (divert water from the playground area); sound-absorbing panels in classrooms, commons, and dining room; outdoor permanent signage (installed 4/23); and Bye-Bye Buggy (purchased). In our 2nd reimbursement request, we included playground equipment for toddlers and preschoolers/school agers, contractual work and equipment for our prep kitchen, and supplies and equipment for classrooms and dining room. Over 40% of our \$240,000 grant award is earmarked for staffing our new preschool room. The objective of the grant, which qualified us for the award, is to create new childcare slots. In our application we said that we'd create 14 slots before the end of 2025.

Our goal is to open the second preschool room on June 2 when we enter our summer programming months. The current preschool class will be split almost in half to create a PreK3 and PreK4 class.

Enrollment:

42 total enrolled 34 PT/FT enrolled

Looking ahead:

Refine staffing plan for summer months and decide preschool classroom split.

Proceed with DEED grant projects.

Intend to move forward with Parent Aware enrollment for July 1 cohort benefits are to become eligible for grants, early learning scholarships, and teacher/director coaching.
